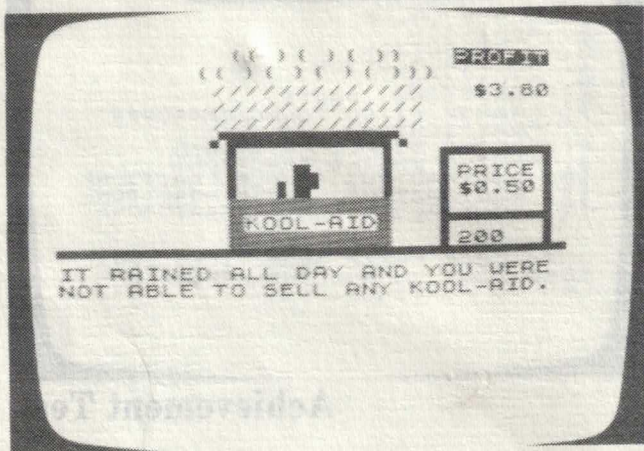


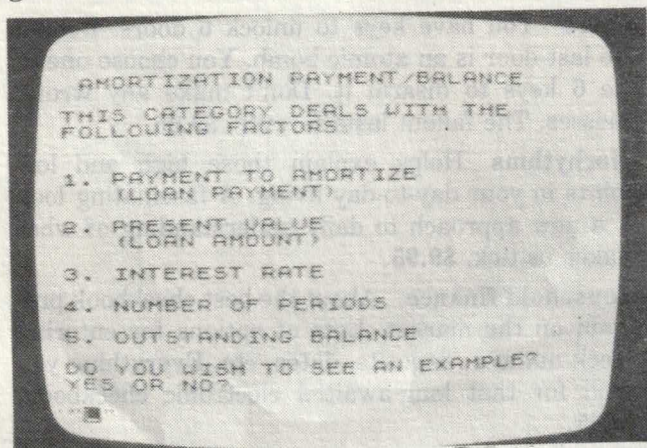

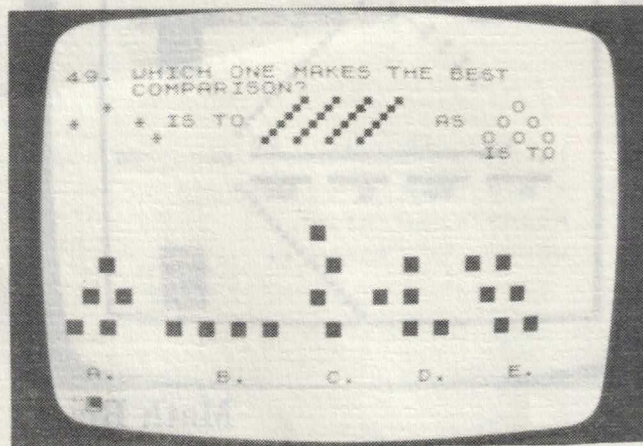
## Kool-Aid Stand

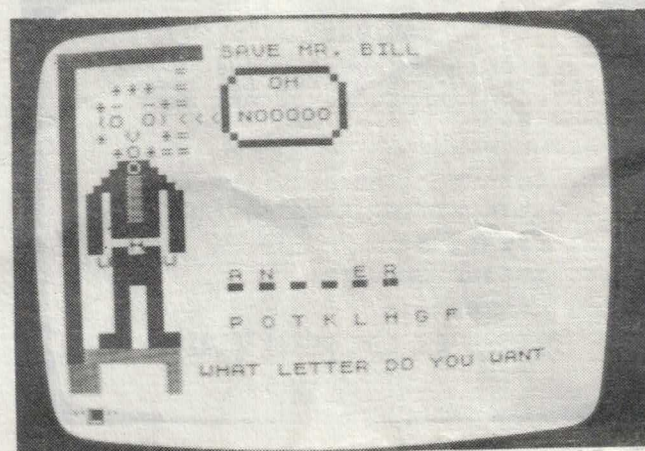
## Business Analysis

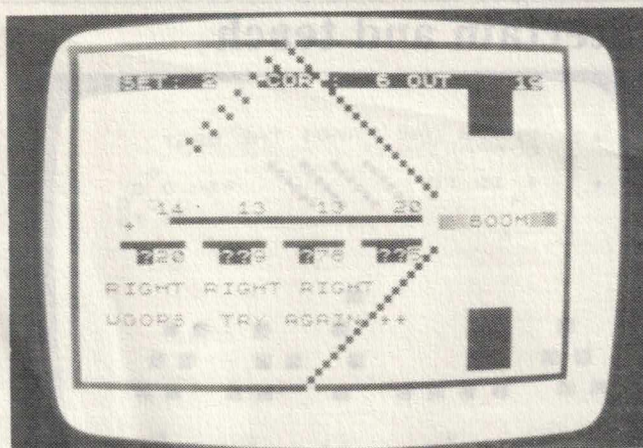

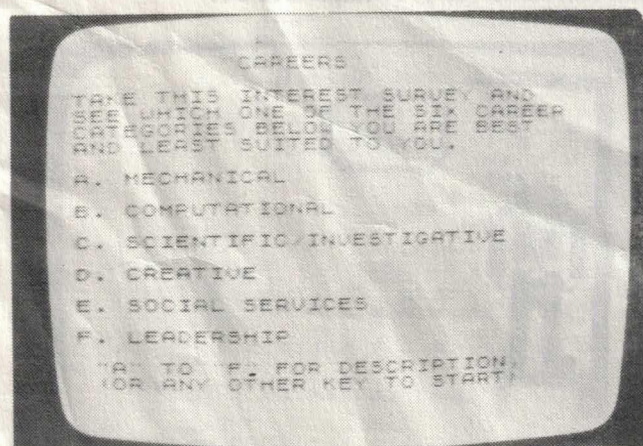

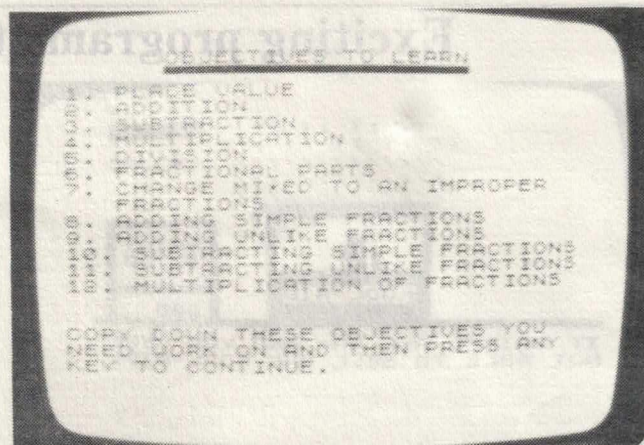
### Math Blast
